Specific Risk Assessment procedure in the framework of the Codex Risk Analysis:

- Hazard identification
- Hazard characterization
- Exposure assessment
- Risk characterization

Guidance for governments on prioritizing hazards in feed (CAC/GL 81-2013)

Prioritization of hazards in the framework of the Codex Risk Analysis:

- Prioritization process in 7 steps: Scientific based ranking of Hazard/Feed/Edible product combinations
- Update on hazards in feed (FAO/WHO expert meeting in May)

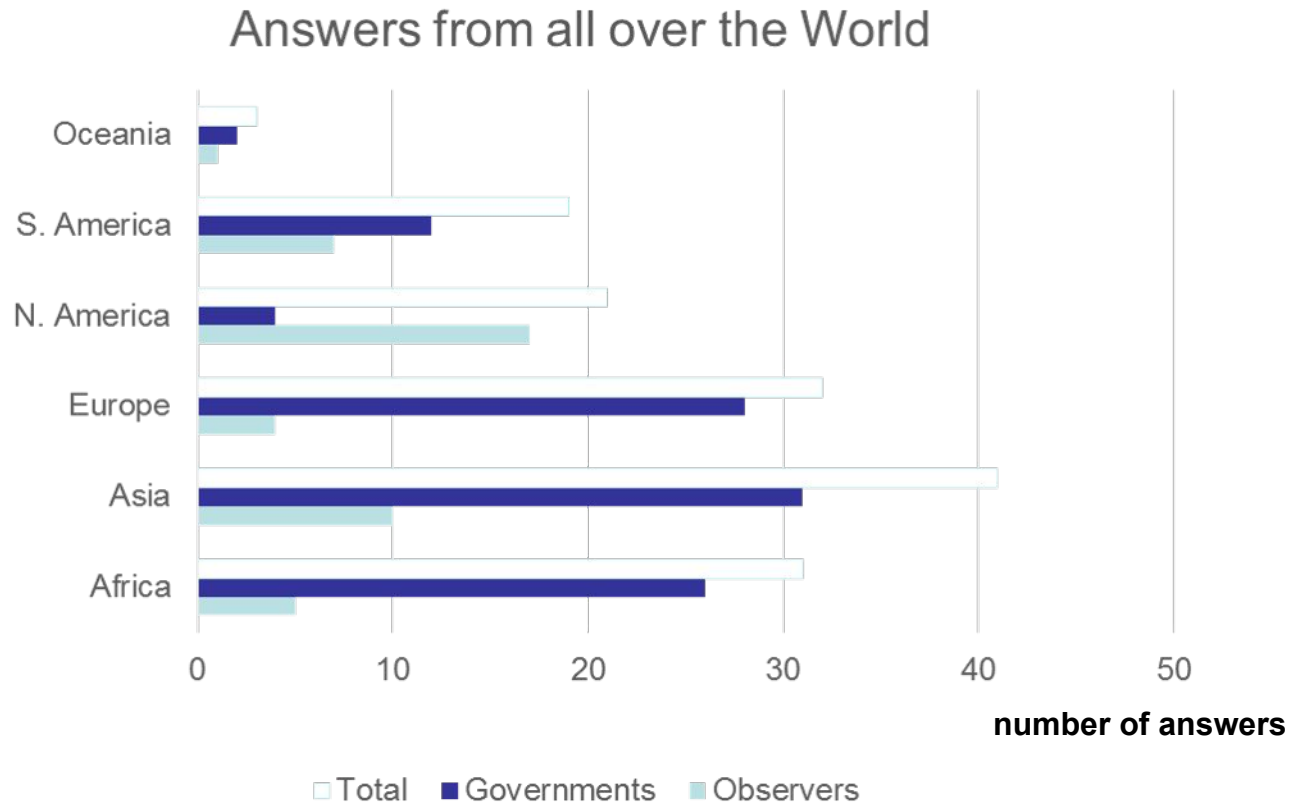

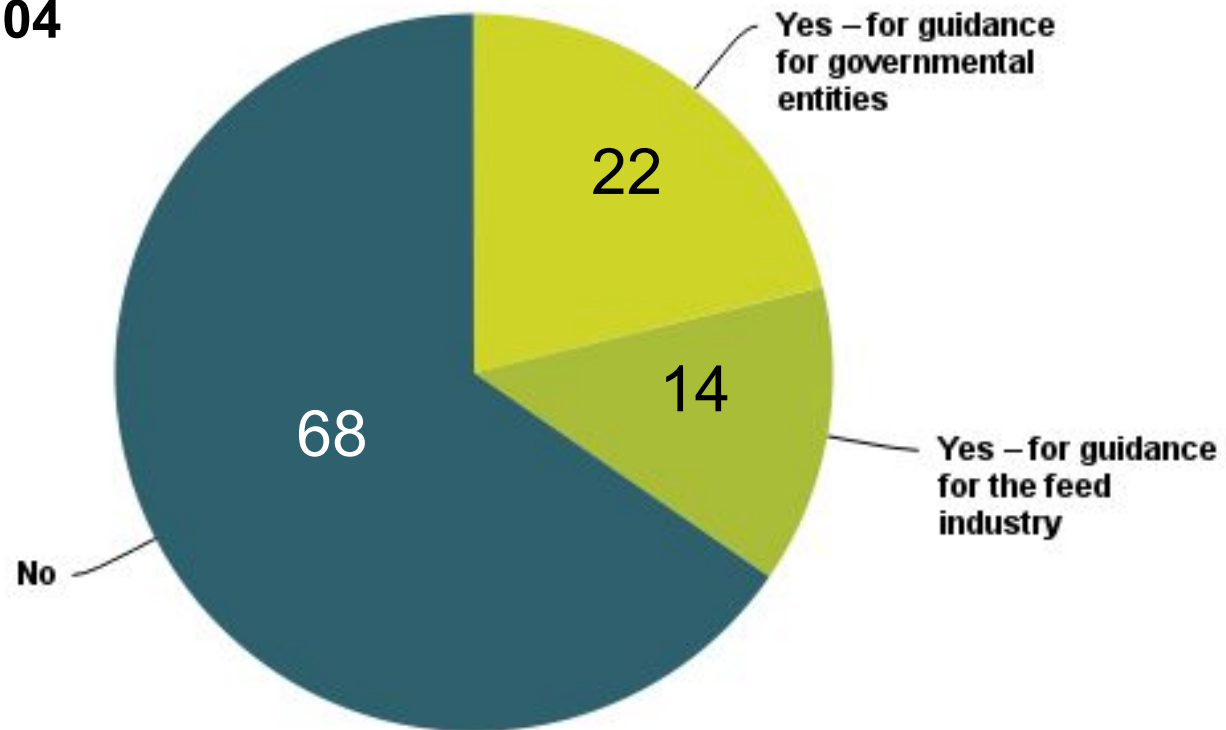

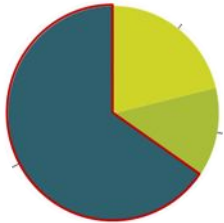

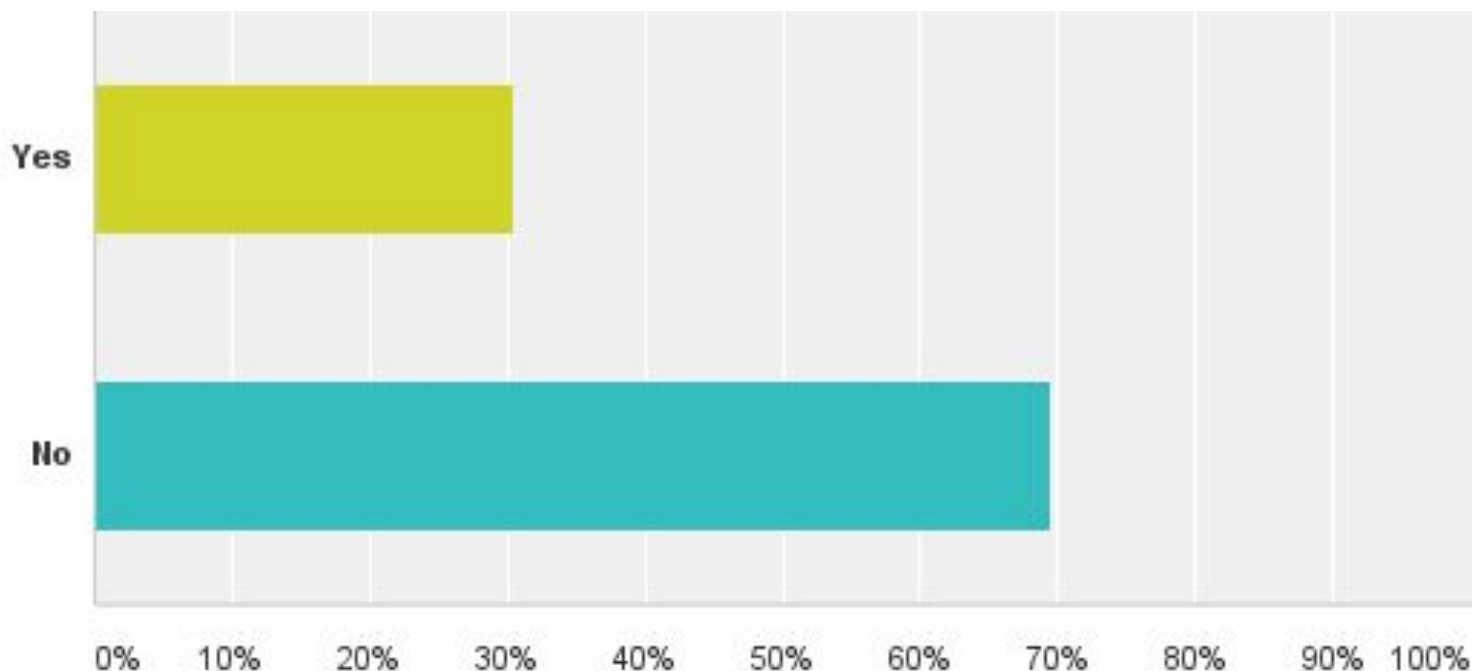
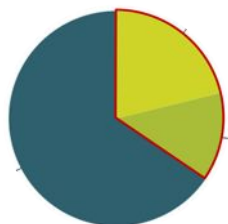

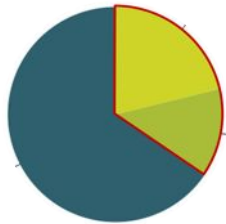




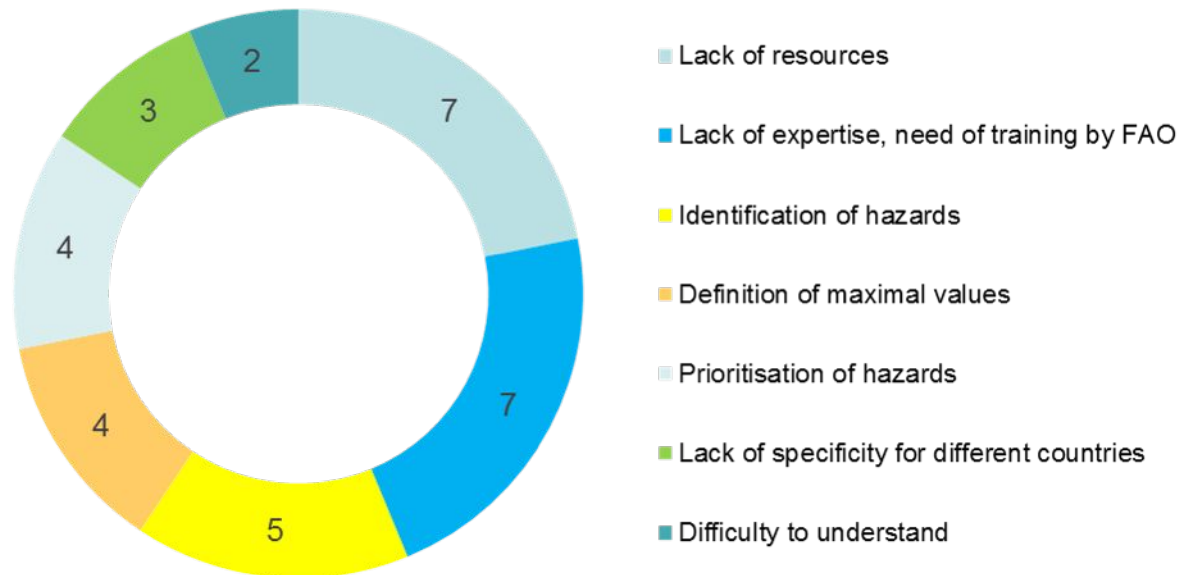

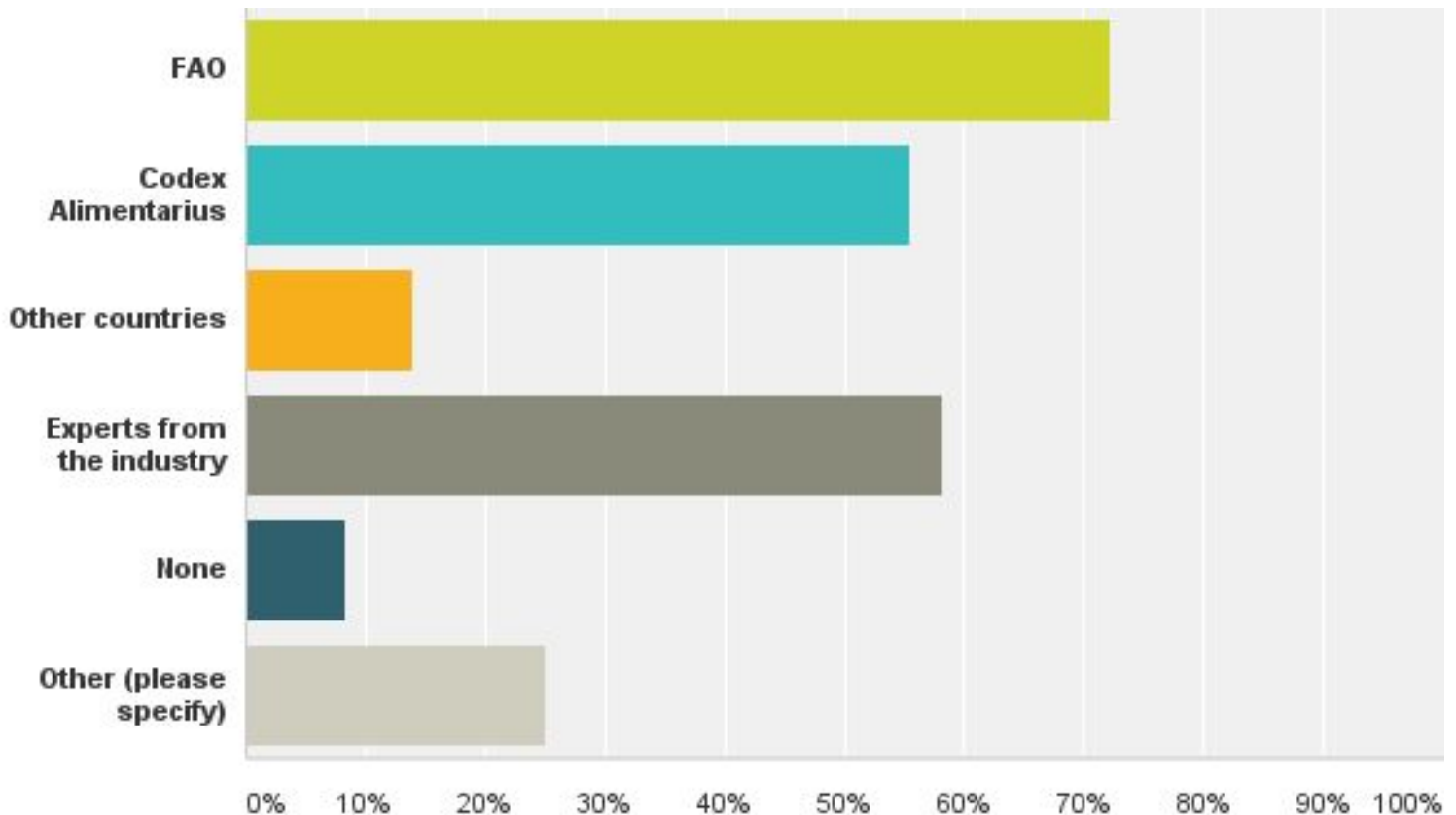
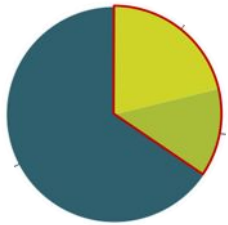
Difficulties using the two documents

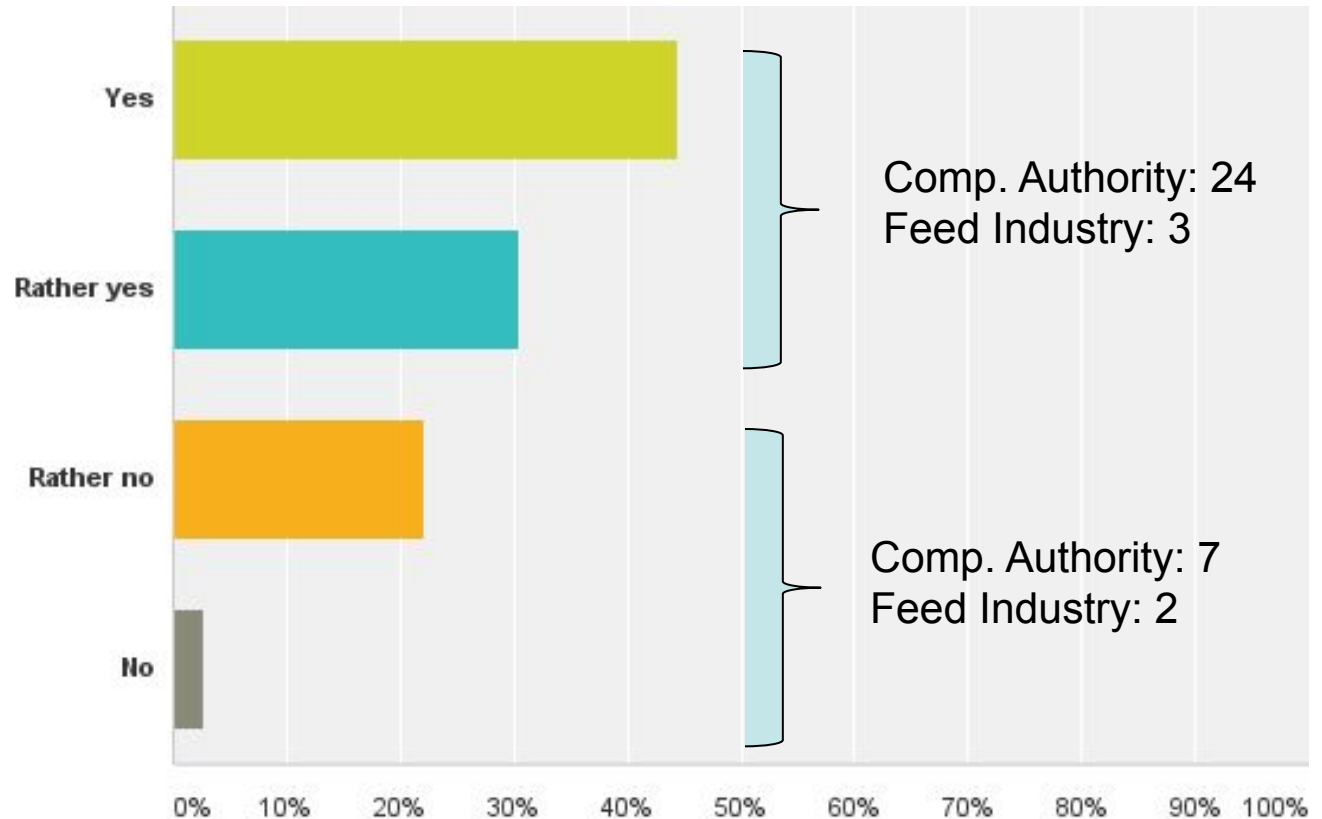
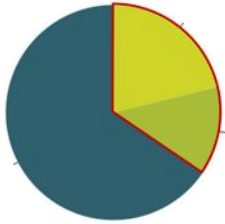




Question:

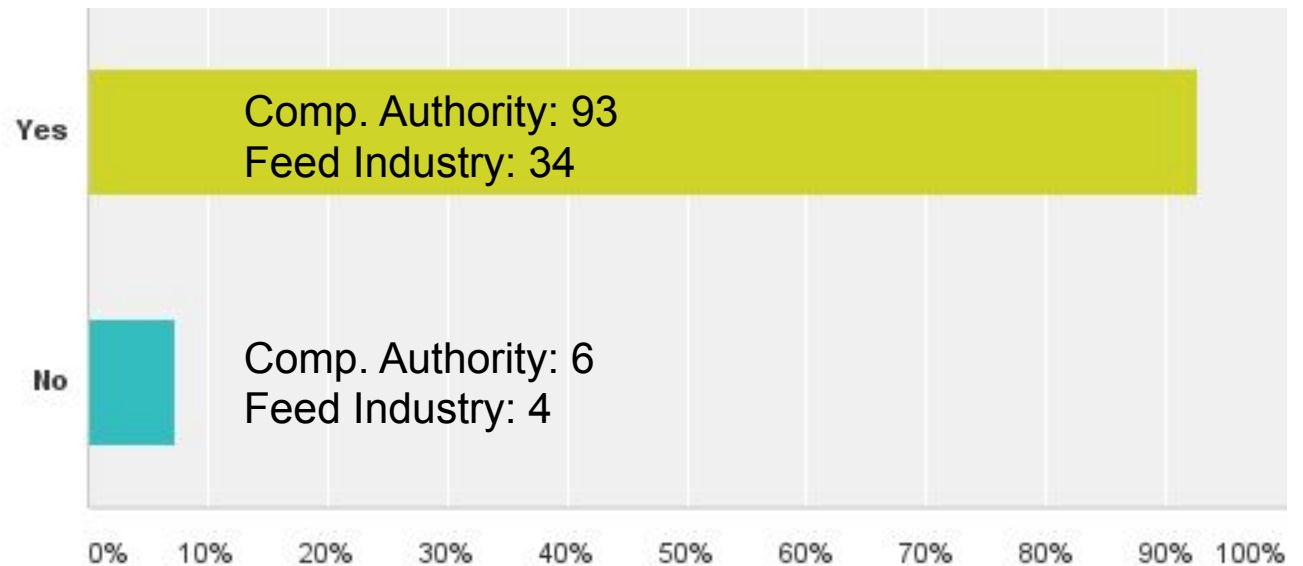
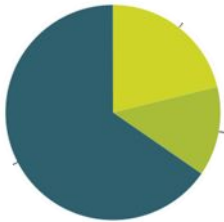




Question:

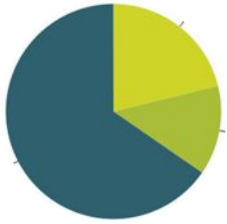
